Technology Enrichment for Ballard Students

A portion of the 5k will benefit the Ballard Community School District's exploratory technology program. This program is in the vanguard of instructional technology, currently utilized in just four districts nationwide. When implemented, Ballard will be the first district in the state of Iowa using this technology.

Program in Action

Story Maker and Animation Now together are a solution with unlimited possibilities. The software gives students the power and quality of broadcast media to share their experiences with the world using engaging, high quality technology. This is a unique project, in that the technology lends itself seamlessly to all content areas creating a real world, interdisciplinary opportunity for learning.

There are two initial entry points for this project. The first is the Production Media class at Ballard HS. Students in this class, which already have a green screen studio, will create content for a variety of audiences, including but not limited to: elementary students to reinforce positive behaviors and 21st century skills, special interest stories for high school students, district information for our local community, promotional content for special interest groups like the Ballard Education Foundation, and a national audience of students on a dedicated YouTube channel.

The second entry point is for a six week exploratory class for all eighth grade students. For a six week period, teams of students will create an authentic animation short to address a need in the school or community (i.e. a safety procedure for Kindergarten students, promoting a vacation bible school at a local church). In addition to learning writing standards like character and premise, students will learn important career readiness skills like collaboration, creativity, complex communication, flexibility, productivity, and accountability. The bottom line is students are given an opportunity to produce an authentic product with a real audience while connecting academic standards, state of the art technology, and career readiness skills.

Over time, as more students become proficient with the software they will recognize limitless opportunities for creating content in all academic disciplines. In addition, an animation club will be formed to provide those students with a true passion for the work an opportunity to create more sophisticated animation stories.

Other Programs Benefitting from Event

The Ballard Community Kiwanis is partnering with The Ballard Community School District, Ballard Dental, The Ames Lions Club, and others to help meet the dental and eye care needs of under and uninsured Ballard students.

Kiwanis and the Huxley Fareway have teamed up to collect food donations that are given directly to Ballard students in need.
